# 81 Years of Good News

It was indeed a day of rejoicing! A gathering of Saints, loved ones and friends from here and across the waters, at The Apostolic Faith Church, Molokai Branch located in the hills of Kaunakakai to celebrate the 81<sup>st</sup> Anniversary of the Gospel work on

Molokai. The celebration commenced with The Lord's Prayer led by Head Pastor Billy Han, Jr. followed by a rousing opening rendition of "Let's Talk About Jesus!" Musical selections by the orchestra, choir, soloist, instrumentalist and congregation told the story in music and song. We had indeed gathered to talk about Jesus; and to glorify Him with praises and thanksgiving. "The Fight Is On" declared the spiritual position of the Saints of God in life; with a cry to the Lord for where to hide in "Hide You In The Church. Blood." Selections of music and

song promoted hope: "Looking For That Blessed Hope," "It Is No Secret," "Hold The Fort," and "When The Saints Go Marching In." A medley by the choir of "What A Day That Will Be" and "What If It Were Today?" called the congregation to attention.

With the musical program concluded, Head Pastor Billy Han, Jr. proceeded with his sermon: "81 Years of Good News." It was a declaration of history, thanksgiving, purpose and definition of the Gospel, the Good News that Jesus Saves, Jesus Heals, Jesus Baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire, and Jesus is coming soon. He recalled the generosity of Sister Christina Lima's donation of the land for the church in Pukoo. He related how the mission of Molokai had begun in the home of the late Pastor Gus Nihoa at his homestead in Hoolehua. It was on March 26, 1944 that the first Molokai Branch Church, located in Pukoo, was dedicated to the glory of God; the only

church built of all new building and construction material during the war years. In July 1964, Pastor Rodney Asano, Sr. was raised up as the Pastor for the church in Kaunakakai. On August 3, 1997, Pastor Reginald V. Castanares was ordained and

raised up as Pastor for the Molokai Branch Church.

Rejoicing, Pastor Billy Han, Jr. declared: "This is the day that the Lord hath made, we will rejoice and be glad in it" for when we walk with the Lord, "we walk by faith and not by sight" (I Corinthians 5:7). What is Faith? "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1) In Genesis 17:1, the Lord says to Abram: "I am the Almighty God, walk before me, and be thou perfect." Yes, we know that there is only one Lord and only one God, and His name

is Jesus! In answer to an inquiry as to the greatest commandment of all, Jesus replies: "Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord: And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment." We must love our Lord God with all our hearts, minds and souls and work towards unity becoming more Christ like each day that we not be deceived by false doctrines and cunning craftiness (Ephesians 4:13-14), and love our neighbors as ourselves. God's ways are immutable and we should fear before him. (Ecclesiastes 3:14). This fear is our love for the Lord. We must walk before God in truth with our whole heart and soul (I King 2:4) and stay in the Lord's light as we walk with Him. (Romans 6:1-5) While we await the Lord's call to "Come Up Hither," we must be ready. The invitation went forth to choose Jesus and believe and obey the Gospel. Pastor Han expounded

## Jesus Christ Our Risen Lord

Jesus Christ, our risen Lord, is gone into heaven and is on the right hand of God the Father (I Peter 3:22). And now from that vantage point, He continues to work through the power of His Holy Spirit. And it is the same Holy Spirit that worked through His Apostles and old time Saints, and on out to you and me today as His Church, and faithful Body of Believers. The Gospel rests upon the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ as defined by Paul in I Corinthians 15:3-4, "For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures." The unique fact of the Gospel of Jesus Christ is the Resurrection, whereby all other religions record the death of their leaders, and only the Christian faith records the Resurrection of its founder. All other religious leaders are dead, and Only Jesus Christ, our risen Lord, is alive today in heaven above.

Jesus Christ proclaimed to Martha, "Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live. And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?" (John 11:25-26). And during His 40-Day resurrection period, Jesus Christ being assembled with His apostles and disciples, "...commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father, which, saith he, ye have heard of me. For John truly baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence. But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ve shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight" (Acts 1:4-5, 8-9). And after tarrying for 10 days, the 120 on the day of Pentecost were filled with the Holy Ghost, "And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance" (Acts 2:4), thereby establishing God's first true Church upon the earth. Peter then preached using His God-given keys, to unlock mankind's personal plan of salvation in Acts 2:38, and 4:12, "Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remissions of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. Neither is their salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."

The Lord Jesus Christ comforts us as His believers today, just as He did then with His disciples saying, "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also" (John 14:1-3). Hence, God's Word teaches us of the imminent and impending second coming of Jesus Christ for His Church, the Bride of Christ, in I Thessalonians 4:13-18, "But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him. For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep. For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Wherefore comfort one another with these words.'

God's Word gives mankind this final warning, when Jesus Christ will return to rapture His waiting Bride, the Church, in Revelations 4:1, "After this I looked, and, behold, a door was open in heaven: and the first voice which I heard was as it were of a trumpet talking with me; which said, Come up hither, and I will shew thee things which must be hereafter." We, His Church, will then be caught up to meet Jesus Christ our Risen Lord, in clouds of glory, and we shall receive everlasting life in heaven above forever, and ever.

### Jesus Christ our Redeemer

I was pleasantly surprised to look up the word "redeemer" in one of the available dictionaries and found the definition: "Jesus Christ, regarded as the savior of humanity through his death on the Cross." In the Old Testament, a redeemer is defined as one who bought back one's debt, penalty or avenged the wrongs done to his kinsman or relative. Jesus, no doubt, fits this definition.

There are many songs that portray Jesus as man's redeemer and that His blood cleanses one from all sins (Ephesians 1:7; Colossians 1:14), but one of the old-time hymns that we have learned and, remembered and that we still sing today is the song entitled, "WHEN I SEE THE BLOOD." The words of the first verse reads as such:

Christ our Redeemer died on the cross, Died for the sinner, paid all his due; Sprinkle your soul with the blood of the Lamb, And I will pass, will pass over you.

Those who truly have been saved by the blood of the Lamb can most assuredly say with jubilation, "Our Redeemer lives!" Jesus lives! He spilt His blood for all humanity, paying the sinful debt mankind incurred. Jesus unselfishly shed His blood on the cross of Calvary. He was the one and only perfect sacrifice, once and for all, for it was not possible that the blood of goats and calves could wipe out and redeem mankind from their sins. By His sacrifice, Jesus obtained eternal redemption for us (Hebrews 9:11-15).

Jesus Christ, our Redeemer (Isaiah 47:4), the Holy One of Israel, was made flesh and dwelt among us (John 1:14) paying our debt (I Corinthians 15:3,4), delivering all who will come to Him from the bondage of sin (Romans 3:25, 6:23).

The introduction to the book of Job tells us that Job was a man regarded as perfect, upright, fearing God and hating evil. The quality or attribute of "perfect" describing Job does not mean he never sinned, for all men sin and come short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). What the author was saying was that Job's relationship with God was right, in that he lived by the Psalm that points out that "The fear of the LORD is clean, enduring for ever: the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether" (Psalm 19:9).


God allowed Satan to test Job. Job's livelihood, servants, sons and daughters all perished. Job was tested even further by being afflicted with boils from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head. With all the calamities that had befallen him, Job was encouraged by his wife to curse God and die! Yet, in all this, Job sinned not with his lips nor did he charge God foolishly (Job 1,2).

Job, suffering greatly, answered one of his miserable comforting friends, "For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth: And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God: Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another; though my reins be consumed within me" (Job 19:25-27).

Job had no certain hope of future life. Job could not be sure of what happened after death, but he had remarkable faith that he would one day see God. At this particular point in history, it may have been impossible or improbable for anyone to have a sure hope of everlasting life. But this hope of everlasting life became sure after the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and the wonderful message of the Gospel. The Gospel which is the Good News that Jesus saves, Jesus heals, Jesus baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire, and last but not least Jesus is Coming Soon!

God sent His Son into the world that all would come to Him not willing that any should perish. Jesus, the Lamb of God, without spot, without blemish, the perfect sacrifice, shed His blood at Calvary, paying the penalty for all of mankind's sins. He was laid in the tomb and arose from the dead and is alive forever more! Jesus is alive and because He lives, all who come in faith believing that He is alive, have that wonderful promise of eternal life. This is possible because our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ is our Redeemer!



## A Dream Fulfilled


