## GREAT IS YOUR REWARD

To those who hold onto God's truths found in the *Bible*, there awaits a great reward. When we not only hear, but also do what God instructs, He pours out blessings and rewards! One such person who experienced God's reward for his faithfulness was Abraham. A "friend of God" (*Isaiah 41:8*), Abraham chose to listen to what God had to

say and entered into a covenant (agreement) with God: a covenant that brought Abraham a great inheritance of land. He then entered into the land of Canaan where his descendants prospered throughout the ages (Genesis 12:1 -3). Today, Jesus invites us to come into His family and prosper. How? By having a change of heart, accepting Jesus as your Savior and being baptized into His body, born of water and Spirit (John 3:5; Acts 2:38; 4:12). By doing so, we enter into an even better covenant with Jesus to inherit a place in His Heavenly Kingdom. This is our victory! "For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith. Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?" (I John 5:4-5). As spiritual Israelites, we must labor to lead others to Jesus. "Be strong therefore, and let not your hands be weak: for your work shall be rewarded" (II Chronicles 15:7).

The world is flooded with false teachings. Which, like pitfalls, cause many to slip and lose God's benefits. For this reason, we need to refocus on Jesus. How? By daily thinking on the truths found in the Bible, as well as prayer. When tempted by the devil, Jesus remembered the Word of God. Filled with the Holy Spirit, He resisted the temptations of the devil by speaking the Word of God into every test that came His way. "... Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). Are we speaking the Word of God into every problem we face? Or, are we allowing the devil to influence us into wrong actions? Follow the example of Jesus and you can claim the victory over temptation. The Apostle Paul did just that and finished his mission on earth. Paul wrote, "I can do all things through Christ which strengthened me" (Philippians 4:13). Job endured his testing and spoke of God's Word too. "For I know that my redeemer

liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth. And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God" (Job 19:25). He humbled himself, repented (Job 42:5-6) and received a double portion (Job 42:10) of what he had lost. We too will enjoy success with the Word of God in our hearts daily!

Through our service to Jesus, we accumulate countless benefits. Just as we do on our jobs where we build up benefits along the way, some of which we enjoy immediately and others at our retirement; Jesus gives us both short and long term benefits. In *Psalm 68:19*, the scripture tells us, "Blessed be the Lord, who daily loadeth us with benefits, even the God of our salvation." While we have strength, let us serve God with a cheerful heart and He will provide for all our needs for great is our reward!

## **REJOICE IN THE LORD!**

The entire letter Paul wrote to the church at Philippi can be summed up in the words he wrote, "Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice" (Philippians 4:4). We need to recognize that when Paul wrote this letter he was not surrounded in luxury but rather serving as a prisoner in a Roman jail. Physically he was weak. He was depend-

ent on others for a living with little hope of being set free, with only death as a martyr looming in the future. Yet with all this darkness, gloom and doom around him, he exhorted and encouraged all to rejoice as he rejoiced!

As Paul encouraged the Philippians to rejoice, so, too, the Lord encouraged all to rejoice! We need to rejoice no matter what the circumstances may be. To have this joy constantly, we must be separated from the things of the world. The Lord wants all believers to be holy for He is holy (Leviticus 11:45). When we are in a "perfect" state with the Lord, presenting ourselves a living sacrifice (Romans 12:1-2), we are truly able to rejoice in the midst of difficulties, discouragements, opposition and persecutions, "...for the joy of the Lord is your strength" (Nehemiah 8:10). But one who wanders and strays off His "Lighted" path will lose and not experience the joy of the Lord.

As we walk with the Lord we find it is easier to rejoice when we come to an understanding that the peace that Jesus has and gives to all that will receive and trust Him, knowing that no matter what happens, He knows what He is doing and will work all things out in His time, His way, to His own honor and glory, "...the peace of God which passeth all understanding (human reasoning or thinking), shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:7) remembering, "...If God be for us, who can be against us" (Romans 8:31)?

We must also let our "...moderation be known to unto all men. The Lord is at hand" (Philippians 4:5). One must be kind, courteous, considerate, thoughtful, gracious, having a patient spirit even when being persecuted wrongly or for righteousness sake. Temperance or self-control is one part of the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). This moderation is an expression of the peace that Jesus gives, that the world cannot take away (John 14:27). Paul and Silas shared their moderation with the Philippian jailor and his whole house was saved (Acts 16:25-34).

We are also instructed to "Be careful for nothing..." (Philippians 4:6). Stop being overly anxious or worried! Instead of making a big fuss over something that

you may have no control over, why not take your troubles to the Lord? Stop worrying and pray! "...With men it is impossible, but not with God: for with God all things are possible" (Mark 10:27).

As we make our requests known unto the Lord, let us remember to come into His presence with thanksgiving. Thanksgiving for what He has done and what He is going to do, knowing that our Heavenly Father knows our every need and cares for us as one of His dear children making a way where there seems to be none.

It makes the Lord happy when He finds one in unity with Him and the Body of Christ, and that ones abiding love for Him is maintained and not fading away and that the joy of the Lord is not diminished or disturbed in anyway when faced with test, trials and persecutions. Jesus wants His people to be happy, "...yea, happy is that people whose God is the Lord" (Psalm 144:15).

The Word of God exhorts all to rejoice. Let us rejoice in Him and let us always have a song in our heart, singing unto the Lord, coming before His presence with thanksgiving, making a joyful noise unto Him, for the Lord is a great God, He is the King of Glory (Psalm 95:1-3)! As Paul encouraged all those at the church at Philippi (as recorded in Philippians 4:4), I encourage all to do the same. "Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice!"
