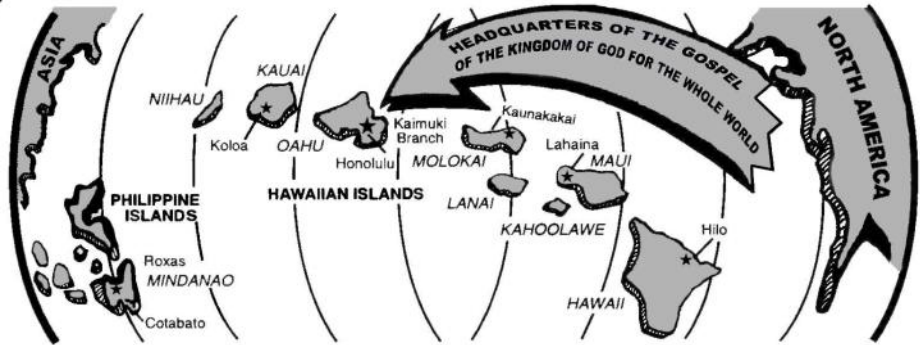

Ye Shall Know The Truth

The Spirit (Jesus who existed before the foundation of the world, *1 Peter 1:20*) spoke to the Jews with these commanding words, "...If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (*John 8:31-32*). Those words moved the people to believe, yet those claiming theological prowess influenced those same people to pick up stones to kill Jesus (*John 8:59*). The Jews (part of mankind or human race encompassing all people) took offense that Jesus said they were sinners and neither a hallowed people though having a genealogy leading back to Abraham. As Abraham's descendants they assumed an eliteness and spiritual superiority to that of any people and culture. Paul, being himself a Jew and of the tribe of Benjamin, refuted that irrational presumption and said, "*For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God*" (*Romans 3:23*). Similarly, Jesus being judged by Pilot confronted and challenged the Spirit (Jesus); "What is Truth" (*John 18:38*)? Thus, the spirit of unbelief and anti-Christ is not confined to an era or dispensation but is universal and occupies the spirit of man in whatever time and place mankind exists. The truth sets us free from the consequences of sin and eternal separation from God (*John 8:32, Romans 6:23*)! Jesus is the Spirit of Truth (*John 16:13*) and the Spirit of God is present in Him without "measure i.e. having no limits (*John 3:34*)" establishing the way with dependability, reliability, infallibility, and firm consistency (*John 14:1-6, Galatians 4:4-7*). Jesus saved mankind by shedding His blood on the cross, thus paying the price of sin, and absolving mankind of inherent sin. Mankind fails to realize the soul never dies!

The Gospel of John describes Nicodemus as a prominent and devout Jew. As a Pharisee, he struggled to grasp, comprehend and understand the gospel of Jesus Christ. The void within his heart and uneasiness of spirit preoccupied his spiritual state, and was uncomfortable (*John 3:1-2*). Though wealthy and respected by men and by his peers, Nicodemus chose to secretly converse with Jesus to inquire and resolve his views of spiritual entitlements (*John 3:2-5*). Jesus openly rebuked that ungodly culture of the Sanhedrin and declared His dismay that how such a teacher and spiritual leader could not understand the simplicity of the gospel and said, "*Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things?*" (*John 3:10*). Nicodemus's (theologically dependent) covert night meeting with Jesus allegorizes the spiritual ignorance of the entirety of mankind. It was a futile and unsuccessful attempt to understand the truthfulness of the Gospel Jesus. Jesus said to Nicodemus being born again is con-



version, commitment, and repentance, it is called being saved. "*Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God*" (*John 3:5*). The Oneness of the God-head has been criticized, rejected, ridiculed, and adamantly denounced. Yet it stands up-right and strong like a lighthouse challenged by relentless seas to fulfill its purpose. The Immutability of God, is underscored with His Word and an Oath (*Hebrew 6:17*).

The message of the Gospel is that only Jesus Saves, Heals, Baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire, and is Coming Soon! The initial step is to hear the *Word of God* (*1 Peter 1:23*). "*So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God*" (*Romans 10:17*). The *Word of God* is powerful to convict our hearts (*John 16:8-11*). He convicts the sinner to make a dramatic change. Jesus literally gave us our independence through the ministry of Reconciliation (*II Corinthians 5:18*). By being born again, repenting of our sins, bearing a new heart and a new spirit (*Ezekiel 36:26*) one has been reconciled to God. Peter says, "*Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost*" (*Acts 2:38*). The old life has passed, all things have become new. And ye shall know the truth and the truth shall set you free. "*Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty*" (*II Corinthians 3:17*).

John the Baptist was imprisoned and hated by secularism for his due diligence and obedience to God's Righteousness. Though having baptized Jesus in Jordan, witnessing the Spirit of God rest upon Jesus like a dove finding rest on an approved place, hearing a voice from heaven, "This is my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased," his troubled spirit on the edge of death asked from behind the bars of hate "*Art thou he that should come, or do we look for another?*" Jesus answered, "*And blessed is he, whosoever shall not be offended in me*" (*Matthew 11:2-6*). Those direct words to John the Baptist motivated his resolve, that his efforts were all worth the while, though death lay at the door! Happy Independence Day!

Editorial

Sweeter As The Years Go By

The Apostle Paul wrote to the Thessalonian Church encouraging and exhorting them to “*Rejoice evermore*” (1 Thessalonians 5:16). We of The Apostolic Faith Church headquartered in Honolulu, Hawaii look forward to a day of joy unspeakable and rejoicing!

On August 3, 2025, we will celebrate the 102nd Anniversary of preaching The Gospel of the Kingdom of God, in the State of Hawaii. The Apostolic Faith Church was founded by Pastor Charles and Sis. Ada B. Lochbaum on August 4, 1923 and carried on by our late Chief Pastor William M. Han, Sr. until the Lord took him home on September 26, 2006.

The Lord called Bro. and Sis. Lochbaum through the power of the Holy Ghost at a “prayer meeting” of Spirit filled believers in California on March 5, 1923. On August 4, 1923, Bro. and Sis. Lochbaum and son, August Otto, arrived here via the SS *Cala-waii* from Los Angeles. They obeyed the “Divine call,” forsaking all and coming to the Hawaiian Islands to preach The Gospel of the Kingdom of God and to baptize believers in the name of Jesus Christ, for the remission of their sins, that they might receive the gift of the Holy Ghost, according to *Acts 2:38* and *John 3:5*.

The Lord confirmed His work here in Hawaii with signs following, as miracles were performed in the name of Jesus. Many were healed, baptized, and filled with the Holy Ghost. Many who were baptized came out of the water speaking in tongues, according to *Acts 2:1-4* and some even floating on the water.

During their ministry, Bro. and Sis. Lochbaum preached the Gospel, in power and demonstration of the Holy Spirit, to all who came to hear it. The Gospel is: Jesus Saves, Jesus Heals, Jesus Baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire, and Jesus is Coming Soon.

In November 1949, Bro. Lochbaum arranged for the release and transfer of all personal and real property of the church to the members of the church and arranged for the property to be held in perpetual trust with five trustees who would ensure that the preaching of The Gospel of the Kingdom of God and the doctrines of The Apostolic Faith Church would be carried on for the benefit of all members and all those that come to hear and believe in our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

The current Trustees are: Associate Pastor Edwin H. Sproat, Sr., Pastor Leonard K. Y. Asano, Sr., Sis. Roslyn L. Han, Sis. Bobbi Lynn Eugenio, and Head Pastor and Chairman of the Board, William M. Han, Jr.

On March 5, 1959, after thirteen months of pastoring the work at Lahaina, Maui, Chief Pastor William M. Han, Sr. was brought back to Headquarters in Honolulu. He was then appointed by Bro. Lochbaum to succeed him as the Full-time Pastor and overseer of the work in the Hawaiian Islands.

Over the years, the church has expanded and branch churches have sprung up like and oasis in a desert, amongst them the Kaimuki Branch (Palolo Valley, Oahu); the Molokai Branch Church (Kaunakakai, Molokai); and Maui Branch (Lahaina, Maui). The headquarters has also expanded including the construction of the Temple, Sunday School Complex, offices, parsonage, music rehearsal rooms and Prayer Tower (Honolulu, Oahu); the Hawaii Island Branch (Hilo, Hawaii); Kauai Branch (Omao, Kauai); Cotabato Branch Philippines Headquarters



(Balogo, Pigcawayan, Mindanao, Philippines); and the President Roxas Branch (President Roxas, Mindanao, Philippines).

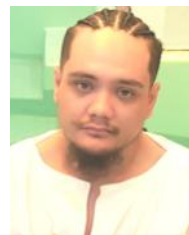
The Kingdom of God Crusade broadcast was aired over the radio waves dating back to August 1968. On January 1980, the first telecast of the Kingdom of God Crusade Telecast aired on the station formerly known as KHVH, channel 4. Forty five years later, the telecast continues to be a blessing to all those who tune in, not only here in Hawaii on KITV 4 and

KIKU, but also at various locations throughout California (San Diego, Palm Springs, Sacramento, Chico, Fresno, Eureka, Los Angeles, San Bernadino, Monterey and El Centro); Eugene, Oregon; Seattle, Washington; Yuma, Arizona; Ogden and Salt Lake City, Utah; and parts of Wyoming; Nevada, and New York City. Since September 2006, the internet has been a source of viewing The Kingdom of God Crusade Telecast.

The Lord has surely blessed His work. We look forward to the many promises and victories ahead. We thank the Lord for those who have gone on before us, leaving us a legacy of love, righteousness and unwavering faith.

Yes, 102 years of preaching The Gospel of the Kingdom of God is quickly approaching. Just imagine that it was all started by two humble and obedient servants, with services held in a tent, in the midst of a patch of Kiawe trees and tangled shrubbery, near a seldom traveled dirt road now known as Middle Street. 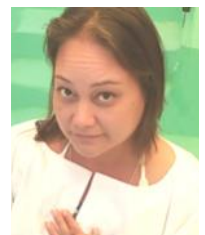

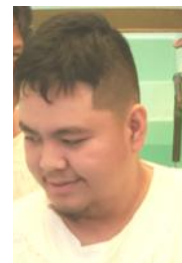

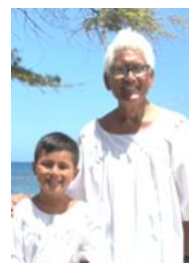

Head Pastor William M. Han, Jr., presided over the service and opened with the Lord's Prayer. Soft background music by The Apostolic Faith Church Band, played sweetly as Head Pas-

tor William M. Han, Jr., welcomed all who came, before calling upon the Church Choir, under the direction of Sis. Emilia Han, to sing, "ALL THAT TRILLS MY SOUL IS JESUS." Head Pastor William M. Han, Jr. then introduced his youngest brother; Bro. Mark Anthony to present the eulogy. It was a very touching and at times light-hearted presentation. One memorable moment that he mentioned, that stood out, was his mother's goodnight to all, followed by an immediate, "see you all in church."

Head Pastor William M. Han, Jr. then introduced his second younger brother; Associate Pastor Timothy Han, Sr. to sing, "NO ONE EVER CARED FOR ME LIKE JESUS."

Following Bro. Timothy's solo, Head Pastor William M. Han, Jr. then presented his sermon and proclaimed the Gospel, that Jesus Saves, Jesus Heals, Jesus Baptizes with the Holy Ghost and with Fire, and Jesus is Coming Soon. According to *John 3:5*, *Acts 2:38*, and *Acts 4:12*, one believing, having an atoning heart, by accepting Jesus Christ as your personal Saviour, being baptized by immersion in, Jesus Name, being filled with His Holy Spirit, and enduring to the end, then and only then can you say, that you have been truly saved, opening the way to enter heaven.

Sis. Roslyn extended a warm thank you to everyone who came and to those who helped, and her family, for all their hard work in preparing for Sis. Han's funeral. She also acknowl-

edged two of their nieces, Sis. Sierra-Lynn Han, and Sis. Senecca-Rose Kalilikane, who assisted in medical matters concerning Sis. Han. Sis. Roslyn and Sis. Han would always say their nightly prayer, which was the Sunday School closing prayer. Head Pastor William M. Han, Jr. then closed with the Benediction.

After lunch, everyone proceeded to the Hawaii State Veteran's Cemetery where Head Pastor William M. Han, Jr. performed the Committal Service, followed by a song by the Choir entitled, "NEARER MY GOD TO THEE." Yes, Forasmuch as it has pleased Almighty God to take unto Himself the soul of this beloved mother, we therefore commit her body to the grave: Earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust, in the sure and certain hope that she shall also bear the image of the heavenly.

Some interesting facts about our beloved **SIS. EVANGELINE LEIMOMI SENNECA HAN**, was born in Honolulu on October 5, 1931, and had an identical twin sister; Agnes Viola Hunter, whom she fondly called "Ola." She was baptized at seven years old, by Pastor Charles Lochbaum, in Jesus' Name in 1938 and received the Holy Ghost at the age of 16. She was the Sunday School Teacher for the Kaimuki Department from 1948 to 1958 and was the Sunday School Superintendent for the Maui Branch Church from 1958 - 1959. She was also a Primary Teacher for the Kalihi Department and a Prayer Band Leader.

Sis. Han was the wife of the late Chief Pastor William M. Han, Sr. They were united in Holy Matrimony on July 27, 1951. They became the parents of five beautiful children the late Millicent (Ronald) Kahele, Head Pastor William M. Han, Jr. (Roslyn), Michael (Shannon), Associate Pastor Timothy, Sr. (Emilia) and Mark Anthony (Kristin). She was also blessed with 8 grandchildren, 5 great-grandchildren, and one great-great granddaughter.

Sis Han was at the late Chief Pastor William M. Han, Sr.'s side in every aspect of the Gospel work. She was the Secretary of the Board of Trustees, Assistant Producer/Director of the Kingdom of God Crusade Telecast and Department Head of the Church Office.

She directed and supervised the custodial and maintenance workings and managed the plants and foliage for the Temple and Telecasts. She kept tabs on the Sunday School Departments in Cotobato and President Roxas.

Sis Han was a member of the Church Choir, Jubilees, served on the Kingdom of God Crusader Staff and prayed faithfully with Chief Pastor at their prayer hour and at Prayer Services.

She accompanied Chief Pastor on his administrative visits to the Branch Churches and when he was called upon to pray for the sick and afflicted in the homes and

hospitals. Truly, she was a wonderful “helpmeet” for the Chief Servant of God.

After assisting Chief Pastor Han and taking care of her family’s needs, she would take her 5-gallon plastic bucket and weeder and proceed to tackle whatever yard work and maintenance were needed, for the Church and the Parsonage. She also had a Greenhouse, which she used to rotate plants that she grew and nurtured for the front of the temple’s Rockwall back-drop, which she also climbed to water the plants as well. Sometimes if you needed to find her, you just had to listen for the banging of her weeder against her plastic bucket, as she cleared her weeder. She took great pleasure, and joy in being outdoors in God’s beautiful fresh air and sunshine doing any form of yard work.

There was also an interesting moment in her life, that she shared with me some years ago. Her story began on December 7, 1941, when she was 11 years old. It started when she and her family; the Kapule’s, Billy, Mona, Helen and the Shigetani’s, walked from Kukui Street to catch the Church Bus. The Church Bus, with Bus Driver Bro. Candido was no where in sight. So, thinking they may have missed the bus, they started walking to church. But as they walked, a multitude of planes kept flying above them, going in the same direction as them, all the way to Middle Street. No one knew at the time that it was the Japanese fleet flying over them to bomb Pearl Harbor.

When they reached the church Pastor Lochbaum was standing outside of the Old Church looking toward the direction of Pearl Harbor. When he saw them, he told them to, “Go home, we’re at war.” A few months after the Pearl Harbor attack, Sis. Lochbaum announced that a Prayer Band would be formed and the prayer band continues on today.
